



# INTRODUCTION

So much has changed since our last survey. A global pandemic hit and changed life as we know it. With it came good shortages, a volatile economy and general uncertainty.

For trucking, it highlighted just how important trucks are to our economy. Truck drivers became even more critical as they helped move food, essential goods and medical supplies across the country.

Our second annual State of Trucking survey hoped to gather how the pandemic has impacted drivers and what challenges they face outside of it.


We checked in with truck drivers to see how the pandemic, the driver shortage and changing safety measures have impacted their lives.

METHOD: This research was conducted in January 2021, surveying more than 400 truck drivers nationwide.

#### A WHOLE NEW WORLD

It's hard to talk about the trucking industry right now without mentioning the pandemic. It has impacted every part of our lives and trucking was no exception.



But the pandemic proved to be not all bad news. A positive that has come out of the pandemic is how much the general public has realized they depend on truck drivers. Before this, many consumers took for granted how their favorite products got on shelves. Now, they realize truck drivers are the reason we get what we need. The #ThankATrucker campaign is still going strong across social media and there is a general increase in awareness of how essential trucking is to our daily lives.

### SAFETY FIRST, SAFETY ALWAYS

The health and safety of drivers is always a priority in the industry and this year has added another level of concern. The number one thing reported by employers that keeps them up at night is driver safety. And drivers echoed the same sentiment.

Our survey showed that over half of drivers don't feel safe on the road today. And the most commonly cited reason is that others drive recklessly on the road.

In addition, almost 75% of drivers find distracted driving a big problem for truck drivers. Not only are there distractions inside the truck, but there are also distractions

outside, including other distracted drivers. **Learn some ways to reduce distracted driving**to avoid accidents and keep yourself safe
on the road.

Thankfully, most drivers reported that they have avoided serious consequences on the road. More than 80% have never been in an accident while driving a truck during their career.

Not surprisingly, fatigue was cited as a safety concern of drivers. More than half felt fatigue is a big problem for truck drivers. This is frequently talked about in the industry and the consequences of not getting enough sleep are high. The Large Truck Crash Causation Study (LTCCS) reported that 13 percent of commercial motor vehicle (CMV) drivers were considered to have been fatigued at the time of their crash. On the bright side, 97% of drivers we surveyed say they get between 7-10 hours of sleep at night.

We've gathered a few tips to help drivers fight fatigue on the road.

#### **DRIVING TOWARDS SUCCESS**

Our survey dug deeper into the life and priorities of truck drivers. We wanted to know what they looked for in a job, why they love driving and more.

Our results showed that on average, most drivers take about 1 driving job per month. In addition to that, almost half said that their last assignment was over 12 weeks long, showing that drivers like stability and consistency.

Despite the pandemic, drivers took the same number of jobs this year versus last year and plan on continuing to do so in 2021.

Our survey wanted to dig into what drivers were looking for when selecting a company. They said:

- **COMPETITIVE PAY**
- **JOB LOCATION AND ROUTE**
- **WORK-LIFE BALANCE**
- TYPE OF JOB
- BENEFITS, INSURANCE AND JOB PERKS

Work-life balance always emerges as a priority for drivers. Stereotypically, truck drivers are frequently away from home, but that doesn't have to always be the case.

Around 30% of drivers surveyed said they prefer to listen to podcasts instead of music. Staying healthy on the road was also a priority, according to our survey. Of those surveyed, more than half make an effort to eat healthy on the road, prepare meals ahead of time, or exercise regularly.

And these healthy habits have paid off. 90% of drivers reported not having any ailments due to driving.

One of the highlights of this year's survey was reading how many drivers have had memorable or positive experiences during such a tumultuous time. Some of their stories are below.




