looking to change jobs this year

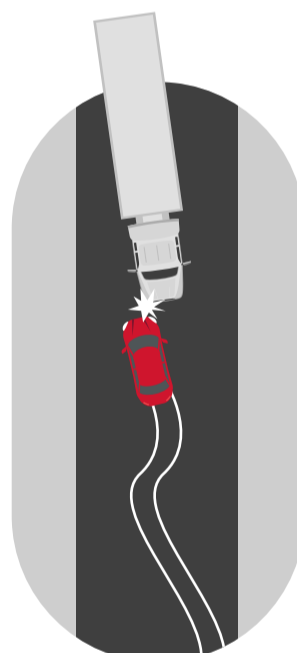
Drivers are looking for stability right now when the future seems uncertain.
